Maureen helps each one. She speaks to the social service worker or resource person directly. It is not only that she knows how to help her students but she has a passion to do what she can to alleviate their problems and pain.

"Maureen is an invaluable member of the ESOL Program at NSCAP," said Beth Hogan from NSCAP. "Everyone at NSCAP feels very fortunate to have Maureen on our staff, and the students know that she is a true advocate for them. She is always there for them."
